

## Community Foundation awards grants

At the April 23 quarterly Board of Governors meeting of the Community Foundation for Cloud County (CFCC), chairman Bob Steimel distributed the foundation's fund summary for the fiscal year (last nine months) which showed contributions received for the period of \$16,263 and grants made of \$98,277. The community investment in the community Foundation as of March 31 was \$667,392.

The Board of Governors ratified the following grants made since the last board meeting: Youth Activities Fund, \$125 grant to Glasco High School after prom party and \$250 grant to Concordia High School SADD Chapter after prom party; Gelvin-Ingersoll Medical Education Fund, \$1,000 grant to Cloud County Health Center to assist with the cost of the Health Stream employee education system and \$1,500 to the Cloud County Community College nursing department to provide furnishings and supplies needed for the title III Grant equipment; Wendy Ann Koch Memorial Scholarship

Fund, one \$250 scholarship; Pauline and Richard A. Cook Family Scholarship fund, four \$1,000 scholarships; and Impact Fund for Cloud County, a \$2,500 grant to Sisters of St. Joseph for seed money for the Neighbor to Neighbor project.

The Board of Governors also approved an additional \$7,500 grant to the Cloud County Historical Society to assist with the installation of the Whole Wall Artwork from the Impact Fund for Cloud County. In June of 2006, the Foundation awarded a \$7,500 grant toward the construction of the Whole Wall Artwork.

Steimel reminded all of the board members that it will need five new members by July 1 election, as board members are limited to two three-year terms at a time. Dana Brewer, Phil Gilliland, Susan Retter, Mike Lamm and Norman Johnson will be completing their second three-year term at that time.
